
Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Highlights of Church Council Meeting October 16, 2025

- On the income side, the offering for September was on the low side at \$9043.00 compared to past offerings normally closer to \$12,000 - \$14,000.
- One of the bell choir tables has been removed from the Sanctuary, providing more room for people in wheelchairs to sit closer to the rest of the congregation.
- Blessing of the Animals was a huge success with close to 30 dogs in attendance.
- · November 16, 2025, there will be a healing service.
- Pastor attended a clergy meeting at Palm Lutheran in Palmyra. The bishop attended as well. Pastor stated that the bishop is very encouraged and still has a lot of vision for the Lutheran Churches. He feels there is still a place in today's society for the Lutheran theology and much good for us to offer to the public.
- Updating the Church Constitution: Neal provided an updated copy of the model constitution for 2025.
 He handed these out to the council members that will be reviewing this. Discussion followed to possibly remove the part of including a youth and a young adult from the congregation to serve on Council.
- Percent of voting members may also be adjusted. It is currently stating 50 voting members for a quorum.

- Nominating Committee: There will be 2 seats open on Council for 2026. Louise Lundquist and Kathy Bishop will have completed their second term by the end of 2025.
- Pastor's Congregational Care Team: Pastor explained how this care team will work. She will create a list of all (non-confidential) shut-in members, approximately 35 members. She is asking for volunteers from the congregation to assist in keeping a connection with our members that cannot attend church. This could be visiting and/or administering communion, making phone calls and/or sending greeting cards. She hopes to have this in place for the Fall and Winter. This small group of volunteers will meet a few times per year to update one another. She gave us ideas of what she talks to people about and how to get them engaged in conversations.
- Pastor stated she and the Finance Committee are planning to put together sessions to help families plan ahead for funerals and estate planning. As she has done several funerals, she has noticed family members do not know what their loved ones' wishes are. ie: favorite scriptures, song, bible stories, spirituality, where they would like their money to go etc. Finance is looking into having someone come to speak about this. This may start in March.



LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

On October 10th 34 mailing boxes filled with Lutheran World Relief 2025 donations were delivered to Salem Lutheran Church, our drop off point for the Lutheran World Relief campaign. These boxes will be delivered to New Windsor, Maryland and from there distributed to points of need throughout the world. Holy Trinity responded to global need by preparing 132 school kits in 20 shipping boxes and 105 personal care kits in 14 shipping boxes. Additionally, \$614.00 was collected to defray shipping costs. \$314.00 of this total was collected in special offerings in September and the remaining \$300.00 was a donation from our WELCA group for this purpose. 

What you need:

- Colorful sheets of thin paper
- Scissors
- Black pen
- Dish of water

What you do:

- 1. From the paper, cut out various shapes and sizes of flowers and petals.
- 2. In the center of each flower, write a praise to God. Thank him for who he is and for answered prayers.
- 3. Fold petals inward, toward the center of each flower.
- 4. Gently place flowers on the water. Petals will slowly unfold to reveal the words.
- 5. Invite meal guests to participate in this center-piece that blooms with thanks.

- 7. Punch a hole in each leaf.
- Lace the leaves, beads, cereal, and pasta onto the yarn, ribbon, or raffia.
