

10. Our youth and families and the joy they bring to our congregation and their future careers and work in the world.

Most of us have had a chance to get to know one another and I continue to meet a few others as I go on visits this spring and summer. We have a great church family here and everyone cares for one another especially during our struggles. It is also fitting to speak about gratitude as the Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (WELCA) celebrate gratitude this month with a Thanksoffering Service on Sunday, May 11, 2025.

We are all called to gratitude and we can all benefit from it! Many forms of support in our society speak to how beneficial it is to learn gratitude. One of the programs I used to be more active in is Al-Anon. Al Anon is support and hope for families and friends of people struggling with addiction. Gratitude is included in part of the recovery process for all kinds of addiction and family programs. A statement from the Al-Anon Family Groups website says, "Even the darkest of moments can be faced with a grateful heart, if not for the crisis itself, at least for the growth it can evoke with the help of our Higher Power...crises, while challenging, can ultimately lead to personal growth and a strengthening of one's connection with a Higher Power." Whether we experience addiction or not, we all have times when we learn to grow from life's situations and lean on our Lord for guidance and peace while we also give thanks.

In the medical community, there are also increasing numbers of studies showing how beneficial positivity and gratitude are for us. Harvard Medical School states, "Recent research has pointed to gratitude's myriad positive health effects, including greater

emotional and social well-being, better sleep quality, lower depression risks, and favorable markers of cardiovascular health. Now, new data from the long-term Nurses' Health Study shows that it may extend lives (2024)."

In our faith community and in faith communities of the past (according to Paul's epistles), we see how important it is to give gratitude to our Lord for the blessings in our lives. From Colossians 3:14-16: "Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God." Paul knew how beneficial gratitude is and that was 2000 years ago before modern psychology and scientific research!

All in all, whether we think about our bodies, our minds, or our spiritual well-being, I challenge all of us throughout May to keep listing 3 to 5 things per day that we are thankful for! Stephanie also made us a bulletin board in the office hallway to express gratitude as a faith community. Listing the things we are thankful for changes our mindset and reminds us to give thanks in our prayers for all that God provides for us.






# Summer Lunch and Learn

# SPECIAL TRAINING FOR EMERGENCIES WITH PASTOR ALTHEA

In 2024, I took "Active Shooter Response Training" with the Department of Homeland Security. In conversation with our Council and others, leaders here would appreciate having some similar training for purposes of worship and seeing strangers in or around our building. The training also applies to violent encounters in any public space. I feel it would be beneficial for our staff, worship leaders, ushers, property team, and anyone else who wishes to have this training attend. It will be an opportunity to discuss our specific context and the emergency response we wish to have too. 



Handicrafts can spark appreciation for simple items. Weave this basket as a gift.

#### What you need:

- Paper plate
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Yarn (different colors)

#### What you do:

- In the center of the plate, trace something round. Draw 9 lines (evenly spaced) from the circle to the plate's edge.
- Cut along each line, stopping at the center circle. Trim more of the plate off so the cuts make a gradual V shape.
- 3. Fold the plate's sides upward to form basket sides. Keep these upright as you weave a bowl-shaped basket.
- 4. Begin weaving a length of yarn at the circle's base. Hold the end of the yarn in place as you spread the length over and under each side of the plate.
- 5. Switch colors to make a pattern. Keep the yarn tight as you weave up the sides.
- 6. To finish, bend down any remaining paper. Leave a tail of yarn and tuck it under a woven portion. Share your craft with a friend!




Make these sweet sandwiches for a Mother's Day tea party.

#### What you need:

- 4 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 3 Tablespoons powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 6-10 strawberries, washed and sliced
- 6 slices of white bread

#### What you do:

- 1. With an electric mixer, whip the cream cheese in a bowl until fluffy.
- 2. Add cream, powdered sugar, and lemon juice. Continue whipping on high speed until mixture is stiff.
- 3. On each slice of bread, spread a layer of the mixture. Then arrange some sliced strawberries on top.
- 4. Place the sandwiches together, with filling on the inside.
- 5. Wrap tightly in cellophane. Chill for two hours so the filling sets.
- 6. Trim off crusts with a serrated knife. Cut sandwiches in squares or triangles. Serve and enjoy!



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
