


Aluminum Can Collection

From the Archives: A Foot-Pump Parlor Organ

A foot-pump parlor organ takes up little space in Holy Trinity's archives room, but its Pennsylvania German music heritage goes back to the mid-1700's. The "patriarch" of the Lutheran Church in America, Rev. Henry M. Muhlenberg, wrote in 1768, "I...convinced old [Conrad] Weiser's sensibilities, so that he gave me his daughter [Anna Marie] as a wife, or helpmate, because at my first visit, I played and sang the edifying Halle [University] songs on his house-organ."1 "One of the first, and for his time, best organ builders in colonial America, David Tannenberg (1728-1804) began making organs and pianos in the 1750's and was still at this work when he died a half century later."2 "Lebanon had [a] small industry which was internationally known—the Miller Organ Company. It was in 1873 that Abraham H. Miller and Adam B. Miller [who were not brothers] became partners in this enterprise, which flourished for some 30 years. ... At the peak of its production, 80 men were employed at the Miller Organ factory and they were turning out 30 organs a week. The organs were shipped (at first by Union Canal to Philadelphia) throughout the United States. Pianos were sold at their retail store on Cumberland Street. starting in 1892. One-third of the organ production went to foreign counties.... It was reported in the Lebanon Daily News on February 20, 1878, that the Miller Organ Company had shipped a parlor organ to Yokoyama, Japan."3 Holy Trinity's parlor organ was built by an independent craftsman, who proudly stenciled "H. L. Long Organ Maker Lebanon, Pennsylvania" on its cabinet. It served Holy Trinity's worship services from April 19, 1891, when Harry J.




Schools was elected as the fledgling congregation's organist, until the installation of the 1903 Barckhoff electric motor organ, for which Harry J. Schools provided its specifications.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KITS AND PERSONAL CARE KITS 2023

The Women of the ELCA of Holy Trinity are participating in two projects for Lutheran World Relief this year - the assembly of 100 school kits and 100 personal care kits. We welcome members of the congregation to join us in helping to make the School Kits and Personal Care Kits goals. The items needed are listed below. It would be especially helpful to receive assistance with the purchase of 70 sheet SPIRAL notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" x 10 1/2". Because each school bag contains 4 spiral notebooks and our goal is to complete 100 school bags we need 400 spiral notebooks. At present we have 94 spiral notebooks toward this goal. In addition if a member of the congregation would like to participate by sewing school bags the instructions for making the school bags can be found on the Welcome Table beginning July 3. All donated items can be placed in the WELCA Collection Barrel in The Giving Place from July 1 to September 3. September 3 is the deadline for all donations.

SCHOOL KITS

For children whose lives have been disrupted by war or other disasters receiving a school kit is a sign that someone far away cares. Adults in literacy classes



appreciate the supplies needed to learn to read and write.

Include the following items in each School Kit:

- Four 70-80 sheet spiral-bound notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8"x 10 1/2": NO LOOSE-LEAF PAPER
- One pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with imbedded steel blades work well)
- One 30 centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other side
- One pencil sharpener
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (NO GEL INK); secure together with a rubber band



- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One eraser approximately 2 ½ " long
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (NO STANDARD BACKPACKS) Recommended fabrics include sturdy cotton, canvas, denim and twill.

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove excess packaging, pack all items in the school bag and close. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags. Detailed instructions with pictures for sewing the school bags are available on the Welcome Table.

PERSONAL CARE KITS

Clean hands, good grooming, bright and shining smiles – you can help bring them about



through the gift of Personal Care Kits.

Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

- One light weight bath-size towel (20"x40" to 52"x27"), dark color recommended.
- Two bath-size bars of soap any brand in its original wrapping (4 to 5 oz bars)
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging. Toothbrush multipacks may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.
- One sturdy comb, wide tooth preferred, remove packaging
- One metal nail clipper attached file optional, remove packaging

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap all the items in the towel and tie the towel securely with ribbon or yarn. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.



VBS Soft Pretzels

INGREDIENTS

1 cup Greek Yogurt

1 cup + 2 Tablespoons all-purpose flour

1 ½ teaspoons baking powder

1/2 teaspoon kosher salt

3 Tablespoons butter, melted

Toppings: coarse sea salt, everything bagel seasoning, shredded cheese or cinnamon sugar

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees.

In a large mixing bowl, combine the Greek yogurt, flour, baking powder, and salt. Mix until well combined and smooth. If necessary, use your hands to mix the dough until it comes together to form a soft ball.

Turn the dough out onto a floured surface and dust the top with flour. Knead a few

times, and then form into a smooth ball. For easier handling, let the dough rest for at least 15 minutes.

Cut the dough into four equalsized pieces.



Roll each

piece of dough into a log, about 10-12 inches long. Form each log of dough into a pretzel shape and transfer to a parchment-lined baking sheet.

Brush the tops of the pretzels with melted butter and transfer to the oven.

Bake for 10 minutes, then remove from the oven and brush with the remaining butter. Top as desired, with either a sprinkle of course sea salt, everything bagel seasoning, cinnamon sugar, or shredded cheese.

Return to the oven, bake for 10-12 minutes more until golden brown and cooked through.


