
But we had hoped that there would be more people in church

We have hoped and we will hope but hope isn't something that we can find in any one or in anything. Hope came to us pinned to a humble cross and permeating out of an empty tomb.

It turns out that when anything about this world, our families, or our church family leaves us feeling hopeless, there is an abiding hope in the crucified and risen Jesus Christ. As we have finally begun to see, this pandemic was not the end of the world as we know it. Strife in our health and strife in our families is not the end. Smaller changing churches are not the end. There is hope for more. There is hope for New Life in the crucified and risen Jesus Christ. It turns out that Easter means it's not that we had hoped. It means that we can hope now and forever. The crucified and risen Christ did redeem Israel and has and will redeem all of us. We can hope! We can help now and forever, not in things or in people, but in Christ alone!

From the Archives Our Church Dedication's Processional Cross, February 24 1957

Although there are at least 18 recognized forms of the Christian cross, our English Gothic church dedication's processional cross was the simple Latin Cross adorned with symbols which expressed the Christian message. The symbol of the cross itself points to the most excruciating and humiliating death worldly powers can exact.

At the center of the cross are two Greek letters, X, "Chi," layered on P, "Rho": the abbreviation of the Greek title XPICTOC, or, Christos in Latin. The symbol of the Chi Rho at the center of the cross points to God taking on the burden, in and through Jesus the Christ, of that excruciating and humiliating agony, manifesting His love for humanity.

Surrounding the Chi Rho is the never-ending Circle of Eternal Life. It symbolizes the resurrection of Jesus the Christ; God's victory over violence and death. It points to Christ's sovereignty over all that exists.

On each of the four extensions of the cross are symbols, each a symbol of one of the Gospels, all of which proclaim the incarnation, crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus *the* Christ:

The bottom extension's symbol is the Eagle with outstretched wings. It symbolizes the Gospel of John because its eloquence sores and spreads the message of Christ.



The left extension's symbol is the winged Ox, which symbolizes the Gospel of Luke because it speaks of patience and service.

The right extension's symbol is the winged Lion, the "king of the beasts." It symbolizes the Gospel of Mark because it presents the royal character of Christ.

The top extension's symbol is the winged Man, which symbolizes the Gospel of Matthew because it emphasizes the humanity of Christ.

Come glorify God together

Don't use summer as an excuse to skip church! By gathering in corporate worship, we obey God's command, become equipped for Christian living, and minister to our fellow pilgrims. Consider these tips for engaging in corporate worship.

First, show up — in person if you can. Examine your heart and your motivation for attending church. Lift up your eyes from earthly matters to focus on God.

Come prepared. Do you need to confess anything or remove any hindrance? As you worship, consider how each part of the service displays the gospel: greeting, singing, confessing, reading Scripture, hearing Bible-based teaching, praying, giving and communing.

Be careful not to compartmentalize corporate worship as separate from the rest of life. Instead, consider how you'll carry the experience into the coming week. Come ready to receive; then let that overflow fuel you for the days ahead. Come prepared to participate, knowing that worshiping together is a rehearsal for heaven. But most importantly? Just come.

On behalf of the Social Ministry Committee and the Children's Sunday School it is my pleasure to announce that our 2023 Noah's Ark Campaign was an overwhelming success. We collected \$2430 in donations. Our initial goal for the campaign was the purchase of seven herds of goats for a total of \$2100. Because of your generous support we purchased 8 herds of goats (\$2400) and one piglet (\$30). Goats are a source of lasting blessings for families in need. Goats can survive in some of the world's most challenging terrain and unreliable climates. They provide fresh milk, cheese, butter and yogurt for the families. Their hair can be spun into cashmere and mohair yarn to weave blankets, sweaters and scarves. They quickly reproduce so they provide an opportunity for families to pass the gift on to others. And they have an inquisitive fun-loving personality which makes them great companions for humans and other animals. A piglet is a big lifesaver. A piglet is a source of natural fertilizer helping a family's crops grow tall and strong. And if needed taking a pig to market is like cashing out a savings account. The funds can be used to pay school fees for children or to cover an emergency trip to the clinic. Thank you for being God's instrument of kindness and generosity by making these gifts a reality for families in need. Together we can accomplish great things in the name of God's love.
