I also would encourage you to look for God in the life of your church. What has God been doing in the life of Holy Trinity as you have been too busy to notice? Where do you find God in your church activities?

who have already filled it out. In filling out this form, you have the opportunity to speak to how God has blessed this congregation and how God has been at work in it over the last several years. What has God been doing in this place and what might God be trying to do? You might consider these questions as you fill out the form.

The call committee will compile the data from the forms and use it to complete the ministry site profile. Once the ministry site profile is complete, it will be approved by the church Council and again by The Bishop's office. The call committee will then receive candidates from the Bishop's office to interview to become the next called Pastor of Holy Trinity.

The call committee will be looking for how God is working through this interview process in order to call the best candidate possible to serve Holy Trinity. They will be looking at how God has worked through each candidate in their previous Ministries. Also the call committee will look at the different gifts that God has given each candidate and discern which candidate God might be calling to serve your wonderful congregation. In these slower and warmer months I urge you to look for God and pray for the call committee as they look for God and find God in the midst of this call process. Look for God and remember that God will show up. God will show up for you as God always does.

Council Notes

Highlights of Church Council Meeting, June 15, 2023

- The roof repair bill of \$30,000 has been paid.
- We continue to operate at a budget deficit. As of the end of May, income was only at 85% of budget.
- There have been problems with live streaming of our worship services. Worship and Music staff feel that a new laptop computer is needed to help resolve some of the issues. Church Council approved procurement of the new computer with funds available in the Worship and Music budget.
- Christian Education Committee met to discuss several topics, with a focus on our confirmation program. It was decided that a new format will be used for confirmation. Additional meetings will be held to work out the program details.
- The 2023 Lower Susquehanna Synod (LSS) Assembly was held on Friday, June 2 and Saturday, June 3. Pastor Tim attended and reported that much of the meeting was spent dealing with business issues. He did note that the LSS voted to expand the number of delegates that each congregation will be allowed to send to the assembly. Two additional delegates will be accepted from each congregation, (1) a youth member and (2) a congregant from an underrepresented segment of our membership. ELCA Bishop Elizabeth Eaton was in attendance and remarked that the LSS is the first synod to make this positive move.
- Property Committee noted that a new sign is needed in front of the church on Lehman Street. The current one is deteriorating. The need for a sign to best identify the rear entrance to the church was also discussed; apparently non-members have difficulty locating the door at times. This issue will be further investigated.
- The two defibrillators owned by the church are not in working order. One is behind the organ; the other is in the Social Room. Neal Galbraith has offered to look into the situation.
- The Call Committee is meeting regularly and making progress.

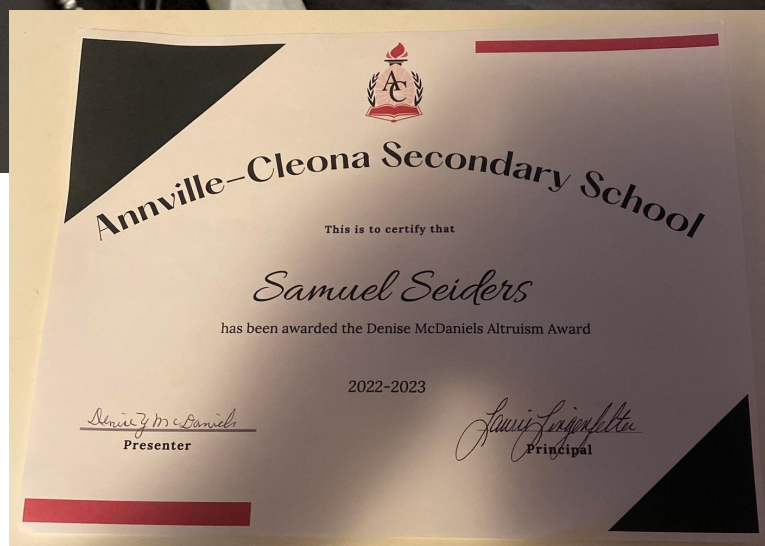
Holy Trinity is at the Heart of Annville-Cleona's Altruism Award

Sixteen years ago at my retirement as Annville-Cleona Middle School Guidance Counselor, the Middle School teachers named a Middle School Award for me--The Denise McDaniels' ALTRUISM AWARD. The recipients are chosen by MS faculty votes, and I present the award to one boy and one girl in both seventh and eighth grade at the year-end MS Awards Assembly. This year I had the privilege for the first time, to present the male seventh grade award to a student I know, and who attends Holy Trinity, our very own SAMUEL JACOB SEIDERS. I later learned that Sam was also the male recipient for the sixth grade GOOD CITIZENSHIP AWARD presented by State Senator Chris Gebhard.

Sam plays Annville Youth League Baseball (first base is his love) and A-CMS Football as an offensive and defensive lineman. He plays trumpet in the school band. This spring Sam participated in the Middle/High School's huge annual Four Diamonds MINI-THON. The donations raised by the kids for the kids totaled \$65,000 for Hershey's Penn State Children's Hospital. It's a few years away, but after HS graduation, like his father, Sam thinks he may enlist in the Army.

Sam loves to go fishing and to play video games, and he is a Church acolyte and a member of the Confirmation Class. Sam often helped his Grandma Yvonne bake cookies and cakes for our Fellowship Bazaar and afterwards Grandpa Ron would load up the car to deliver all the goodies to Trinity.

We have watched Sam grow into a fine young man. His words and actions for others are kind and caring, and he doesn't expect anything in return. He demonstrates the truth in this quote by Anne Frank

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KITS AND PERSONAL CARE KITS 2023



LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

The Women of the ELCA of Holy Trinity are participating in two projects for Lutheran World Relief this year – the assembly of 100 school kits and 100 personal care kits. We welcome members of the congregation to join us in helping to make the School Kits and Personal Care Kits goals. The items needed are listed below. It would be especially helpful to receive assistance with the purchase of 70 sheet SPIRAL notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" x 10 ½". Because each school bag contains 4 spiral notebooks and our goal is to complete 100 school bags we need 400 spiral notebooks. At present we have 94 spiral notebooks toward this goal. In addition if a member of the congregation would like to participate by sewing school bags the instructions for making the school bags can be found on the Welcome Table beginning July 3. All donated items can be placed in the WELCA Collection Barrel in The Giving Place from July 1 to September 3. **September 3 is the deadline for all donations.**

SCHOOL KITS

For children whose lives have been disrupted by war or other disasters receiving a school kit is a sign that someone far away cares. Adults in literacy classes appreciate the supplies needed to learn to read and write.



Include the following items in each School Kit:

- Four 70-80 sheet **spiral-bound** notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" x 10 1/2"; NO LOOSE-LEAF PAPER
- One pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with imbedded steel blades work well)
- One 30 centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other side
- One pencil sharpener
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (NO GEL INK); secure together with a rubber band

- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One eraser approximately 2 ½ " long
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (NO STANDARD BACKPACKS) Recommended fabrics include sturdy cotton, canvas, denim and twill.

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove excess packaging, pack all items in the school bag and close. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags. Detailed instructions with pictures for sewing the school bags are available on the Welcome Table.

PERSONAL CARE KITS

Clean hands, good grooming, bright and shining smiles – you can help bring them about through the gift of Personal Care Kits.



Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

- One light weight bath-size towel (20"x40" to 52"x27"), dark color recommended.
- Two bath-size bars of soap any brand in its original wrapping (4 to 5 oz bars)
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging. Toothbrush multipacks may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.
- One sturdy comb, wide tooth preferred, remove packaging
- One metal nail clipper attached file optional, remove packaging

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap all the items in the towel and tie the towel securely with ribbon or yarn. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

Raspberry Lemonade

Ingredients:

- 2 cups fresh lemon juice (from about 15 lemons)
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1/2 10-ounce bag frozen raspberries

Directions:

Put the lemon juice in a pitcher. Mix the sugar and 1 1/2 cups water to make a syrup, stirring well until the sugar dissolves. Add the sugar syrup to the lemon juice and top with 4 cups water. Taste to make sure it's sweet enough for you, then add the raspberries. (Keep in mind that the raspberries are tart, so be sure to sweeten enough!) Stir the lemonade, then chill in the fridge.

Fill glasses with ice cubs and top them off with the lemonade. ENJOY!

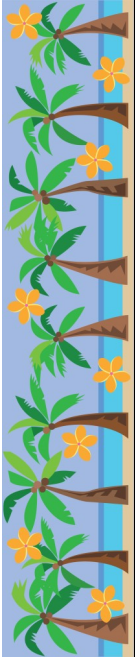
