thoughts on the Lenten devotional from the Lutheran Seminaries.



Highlights of Church Council Meeting, March 20, 2025

- The Bazaar Committee gave a total of \$9000 to the church. Split evenly between the Unified Budget and the Building & Maintenance fund.
- The final payment of \$3400 was made for the air conditioning in the Narthex. This payment came out of the Building/Maintenance fund.
- The month was positive at \$2288.12, but we are still behind by -\$3439.29 for the year so far.
- Discussion was held about passing the offering plates during the church services. This had stopped because of Covid. We currently have plates setting by the side entrance near the Baptismal Font as well as in the Narthex at the front doors. Several council members voiced their concerns that we may be missing collections by not physically passing the plates during service. It was mentioned that many church members pay online and/or they pay monthly; therefore, we do not want to offend anyone by passing a plate each week. It was decided that we pass the plates on a trial basis. There was concern about needing ushers to pass the plates. Council members agreed that there are several people in our choirs or husbands/wives that could pair up to usher together. Agreed that only 2 people are needed to usher. This will begin on April 6, 2025. Pastor will announce this at worship for two weeks prior to its start. We will revisit this at the end of the trial period.
- Healing Service will be April 6th with prayers and anointing.
- The Adult Sunday School class continues studying Luther's Small Catechism.

- Pastor is holding the Lunch and Learn during Lent each Wednesday at 12:00 noon. She reports that attendance has been great with a lot of good discussions.
- Personnel Committee has been formed. The committee is made up of Judy Cassel, Lynn Kern and Robert Snyder. They will meet on a Wednesday soon. Evaluations and reviews will be done on Sundays.
- Pastor is thinking about starting grief support/ healing ministry. She is asking for some suggestions. She feels there is a lot of need for this type of ministry.
- The topic of safety/shooter training was mentioned. Discussion continued and Pastor mentioned that after Easter she will revisit the idea of providing training to church leaders, ushers, staff and members that are interested and set a date.
- Update on Christian Education for Youth A
 meeting was held with teachers, Pastor, parents
 and youth on 2/23/25 to decide how to move
 forward with Sunday School. It was agreed by all
 at the meeting to have Sunday School once a
 month. This being on the first Sunday of each
 month. A fun activity along with a devotion will be
 held once a month as well.
- Volunteers for Greeters and Lectors are still needed. The sign-up sheet is on the Welcome Table.




April 23 -Fire Ecology and History




From the Archives: Building of the Church




Women ELCA



New life defines the season of spring. Make this Easter craft that symbolizes rebirth.


What you need:

- Brown paper lunch bag
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Glue stick
- Jellybeans

What you do:

- From the bag's bottom, cut two 2-inch circles. Set aside.
- 2. From the sides, cut two 10-inch circles.
- Draw a thin spiral on each large circle and cut along the lines. Crinkle spirals gently.
- 4. Starting at the center, wrap one spiral into a nest. Glue every few inches to hold it.
- 5. Glue one small circle to the bottom of the nest.
- 6. Repeat with the other spiral. Fill nests with jellybeans and give to a friend!

- Celery sticks
- Cherry tomatoes
- Cucumber circles
- Olives
- Cream cheese spread
