
I am thankful that Neal Galbraith and Tom Ryland attended the Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly from in assembly June 5-7, 2025. Our biggest news is that a new Bishop has been elected and called to serve in our synod! There were 517 voting



While at assembly, the following actions occurred:

- Welcomed Victoria Flood, Sr. Director for Congregation and Synod Support as churchwide representative, and received greetings from her.
- Recognized 50 Years of ELCA World Hunger and Bishop James and Connie.

Dunlop's generous support through "Kick It to Hunger"; and received a presentation from LSS World Hunger Committee.

- Elected Cynthia B. Kelbaugh as synod secretary for a first term, and re-elected Joseph M.
   Stepansky as synod treasurer for a third term.
- Established slates of nominees for the Synod Council and Committee on Discipline.
- Discerned the call of a bishop through opportunities in small and large group settings with questions and answers and open dialogue.
- Dedicated a memorial commemorating victims of abuse with the artwork installed in the synod office.
- Adopted the Fiscal Year 2026-27 budget of \$2,413,454.01.
- Adopted the 2026 minimum salary guidelines for Ministers of Word and Sacrament and Ministers of Word and Service.
- Elected various new members to the Synod Council.
- Elected new clergy to the Committee on Discipline.
- Adopted resolutions regarding the reporting of ministry site positions in the synod, and regarding boundary, racial justice, and LGBTQIA+ cultural competency trainings.
- Adopted a memorial regarding boundary, racial justice, and LGBTQIA+ cultural competency trainings.

- Called the Rev. Stephen R. Herr as bishop of the Lower Susquehanna Synod to serve a six-year term.
- Received courtesy motions from the Committee of Reference and Counsel.
- Recognized the Rev. James S. Dunlop for his 12 years of service as bishop, his retirement effective August 31, 2025.
- Installed newly elected synod secretary, members of the Synod Council; and conference deans.
- Received worship offering of \$8,022.27 in support of ELCA World Hunger.

I am especially thankful for all those who helped serve at Kirchenwald Camp in June! We had a great time among the trees and children at camp! Many hands were able to accomplish many things! It is also a nice time to get to know one another better. I enjoyed my time with everyone as well.

#### LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KITS AND PERSONAL CARE KITS 2025

The Women of the ELCA of Holy Trinity are participating in two projects for Lutheran World Relief again this year – the assembly of 100 school kits and 100 personal care kits. We welcome members of the congregation to join us in this endeavor. The items needed for each type of kit are listed below. All donated items can be placed in the WELCA Collection Barrel in The Giving Place from July 6 to September 7. September 7 is the deadline for all donations.

#### **SCHOOL KITS**

Education is one of the strongest tools a community has for breaking the cycle of poverty. Ensuring that girls attend school, especially in places where their access is deprioritized, has even stronger results. School kits contain essential supplies to help children – and in some cases, adults—continue learning in the face of serious obstacles. That learning leads to a better life for them, their families and their communities.

Include the following items in each School Kit:

- Four 70-80 sheet spiral-bound notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper approximately 8"x 10 1/2"; NO LOOSE-LEAF PAPER
- One pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with imbedded steel blades work well)
- One 30
   centimeter ruler
   or a ruler with
   centimeters on
   one side and
   inches on the
   other side



- One pencil sharpener
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (NO GEL INK); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One eraser approximately 2 ½ " long
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (NO



STANDARD BACKPACKS) Recommended fabrics include sturdy cotton, canvas, denim and twill.

 Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove excess packaging, pack all items in the school bag and close. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

#### PERSONAL CARE KITS

Cleanliness certainly helps a person feel more human. When families find their homes destroyed, or must flee for their safety, soap and a towel rarely make the cut for what they can carry. Arriving in a refugee camp or other place of safety, they are scared, vulnerable, and dirty from the travel. The simple items included in a personal care kit provide much needed self-care, critical germ fighting and the chance to regain dignity amidst situations of fear and uncertainty.

Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

 One light weight bath-size towel (20"x40" to 52"x27"), dark color recommended.



- Two bath-size bars of soap any brand in its original wrapping (4 to 5 oz bars)
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging.
   Toothbrush multipacks may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.
- One sturdy comb, wide tooth preferred, remove packaging
- One metal nail clipper attached file optional, remove packaging
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap all the items in the towel and tie the towel securely with ribbon or yarn. Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags







#### From the Archives: Building of the Church






#### Calling ALL Ladies!!



You don't have to visit the beach to make a sandcastle. Make fluffy "moon sand" to build fun structures.

#### What you need:

- Large bowl
- Wooden spoon
- 8 cups flour
- 1 cup baby oil



#### What you do:


- Measure flour into the large bowl.
   Add baby oil.
- 2. Mix thoroughly until all the oil is combined and the texture is consistent. If needed, use your hands to knead the mixture.
- The sand is ready when it sticks together to form a ball when pressed in your hands.
- 4. Use sand toys and molds to create a sandcastle. Store sand in an airtight container for up to two weeks.



Geodes look plain on the outside but contain beautiful crystals. Create these "rocks" to show how God makes us new on the inside.

#### What you need:

- Clean cardboard egg carton




- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dye)
- Food coloring
- Glue
- Paintbrush

#### What you do:

- Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
- 2. In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
- 3. With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
- 4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
- 5. Optional: Preserve the crystals with a coat of clear-drying glue.


