





Highlights of Church Council Meeting, November 30, 2023

- We incurred several significant maintenance and repair expenses in October and are at a net income deficit of more than \$36,000 for the year.
- The new copier is in service. While there were some initial costs associated with this purchase, expenses will be less with the new copier in the long run.
- The "Care and Share" box has been installed in front of the church on Lehman Street and is being consistently used. Jay Brown was commended on his work in designing and constructing the box. In addition, distribution of scarves, hats, blankets, etc. has begun.
- Pastor has initiated an Advent devotional series at lunch time each Wednesday.
- The Annual Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, January 21, 2024 immediately following the 10:00 AM worship service. It will be held in the sanctuary.
- The Church Council Nominating Committee is continuing the process of finding three congregation members to serve on Council beginning in January, 2024. An announcement will be made in church that we are looking for new members. In addition, a document, "Expectations for Church Council Members" will be made available to parishioners who are interested in learning what is involved in membership.
- The proposed budget for 2024 was presented by Brad Bishop, Treasurer. The document was reviewed by Council. Brad will make a few changes to the proposal and bring the revised document to the December meeting.
- Information regarding the 2024 Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly is already available. We should begin the process of identifying representatives from our congregation in the near future.



Terry Weaver delivered the items collected by WELCA to the Lebanon VA. Jason Lane, Chief of the Center for Development and Civic Engagement, is pictured holding the gift bag. Inside the bag are 80 combs, 80 lip balm, 80 individual tissues, 80 emery boards and 80 toothbrushes. These items will be inventoried and distributed to the veterans as needed.
